

Toolbox Talk - A Script for Poster 2



A picture paints a thousand words or so they say but the picture is meaningless if you don't know what it is supposed to say.

This box bears a mark (end of orange arrow) that displays a flammable liquid hazard label. The box is also displaying signs that the liquid within has leaked.

All dangerous goods have to be packed in strong packaging. The purpose of the packaging is to protect us and the transport environment from the dangers of the products being carried. Something has gone wrong here.

To allow this to continue with its journey would be dangerous. Your spillage procedures should now be enacted and the box taken to a place of safety where, with the permission of the consignor, it can be opened to determine where the damage is and how extensive it is.

This consignment would need to be repacked, remarked and re-labelled before it can continue onwards to its destination.

If any such packages arrive in your workplace, raise the issue with your manager or better still a DGSA (Dangerous Goods Safety Advisor).

There are specific rules and regulations that must be applied for dangerous goods transport.

Better to be safe....than sorry.
